## CLEAN ENERGY FOR EUROPE...FIRST SHIP IS UNDERWAY FROM MARCUS HOOK

If you come up the Delaware River from Cape May, Marcus Hook is the first town you come to in Pennsylvania and it has a long industrial history. Just a few years ago when Sunoco closed the Marcus Hook Refinery, the future for Marcus Hook did not appear promising. However, those who know Marcus Hook always have been impressed at the strength of its people and new day has arisen.

The first ship left Marcus Hook with Marcellus Gas, headed for Norway. Sunoco is investing tens of millions of dollars to make its former oil refinery in Marcus Hook, a center for transport of clean Marcellus Gas overseas.

As jobs for both construction and operation have returned to Marcus Hook, a company known as Ineos has a one billion dollar fleet of ships ready to move Marcellus Gas on an ongoing basis to England and Norway, where North Sea Energy production has declined.

Marcus Hook has always been practical, with residents reaching for the future and always wanting to do things right. When the former FMC Plant was set for redevelopment, residents insisted that the cleanup be complete and appropriate. Through the Pennsylvania Environmental Council, RT provided assistance to the Town, on a Pro Bono basis. When Honeywell decided to expand its production facility, Marcus Hook retained RT to make sure that Contingency Plans were updated, and in the event of needed Contingency Plan activation, that emergency responders be familiar with the Plant and nearby receptors, and enhanced training and familiarity with the Plant operations became the goal of both industry and the emergency responders, as well.

As Sunoco continues to plan for movement of Marcellus Gas from Western Pennsylvania, West Virginia and Ohio, reverse flow in the historic pipeline which fed petroleum products from Philadelphia to the Pittsburgh and Buffalo area plays the first key role in supplying key energy to Europe, an important milestone. Sunoco is planning to bring more energy pipelines on line, and to minimize

environmental impact during pipeline construction; new pipelines will follow the historic routes of petroleum pipelines, minimizing the need for new clearing of Rights of Way.

We at RT have also been fortunate enough to play a role in bringing the natural gas to market, by obtaining permits for gathering lines for pipelines being installed near RT's Washington, PA (Southwest Pennsylvania) office, right near Pittsburgh.

For decades, the United States was criticized for consuming too much energy and we were criticized for burning too much coal. Greenhouse gases caused many environmentalists to criticize the US as a society which consumes too many resources, impacting the environment. A new day which has arrived allows us to deliver clean energy across the ocean to reduce greenhouse gases, as consumption of fuels such as coal declines.

We at RT are proud to have opportunities to help bring clean Marcellus Gas to the worldwide market, and to help Marcus Hook keep high standards and always require proper work at its sites, whether work includes resurgence of an oil refinery or redevelopment of its Brownfields sites.
